#### Annual Parochial Church Meetings (APCMs)

The APCMs for all four parishes will be held at the same time in Horton Millennium Hall on Wednesday 29 April, starting at 7.30pm. Anybody living in one of our villages is most welcome to come.

Not only is this your opportunity to elect the Churchwardens and members of the Parochial Church Councils (PCCs), but also this year is your opportunity to influence the General Synod of the Church of England, its national 'parliament'. This is because this year we elect new Deanery Synod representatives and these are the people who will have a vote in the election of a new General Synod this summer. Many have said that the present General Synod is not representative of the Church of England as a whole: so please come to the APCMs and elect Deanery Synod representatives that you think will elect General Synod members who will be more representative of the Church of England. There will also be an opportunity to ask questions about each of our parishes.

Note, to vote at an APCM, you need to put your name on the Electoral Roll beforehand (ask Hugh Lee or a churchwarden how to do this) but you do not need to be on the Electoral Roll to ask a question or to vote for the churchwardens.

#### Update on our search for a new vicar

An advertisement for our new vicar appeared in the Church Times and appropriate websites for the four weeks before the closing date on 16 February. Interviews for the shortlisted candidates will be on Thursday 19 March. Please pray for everyone involved in this process including the candidates and the interviewers, who include the archdeacon, Judy French, and two representatives from each parish. Please also pray that we will soon have a new vicar playing a full role in all our four parishes.

#### 'Daffodil Day' at Shotover House, Sun 29 Mar 2.30pm - 4pm

The gardens at Shotover House were laid out in the early eighteenth century and include, among other things, a large obelisk, two ornamental temples or 'follies', and a lake.

The house and grounds are currently owned and managed by the Shotover Trust. There are long-standing links between Shotover and St Nicolas Church

in Forest Hill, and 'Daffodil Day' is an annual event (weather permitting!) in aid of St Nicolas. In return for a small entrance fee, the public is offered a rare opportunity to wander around the Shotover gardens and to enjoy the extensive displays of daffodils and other spring bulbs.



Tea, coffee and home made cake (including gluten free and vegan options) will be on sale throughout the afternoon in the arcade at the rear of Shotover House. There will also be a plant and home-made produce stall. Payments will be accepted by credit/debit card as well as in cash.

St Nicolas wishes to acknowledge the generosity of the Stanier family (who live at Shotover House) in allowing us to hold this event in these private grounds.

#### Oxford-Cambridge Expressway Update

#### NO EXPRESSWAY no expressway.org

**Taking our petition to No. 10!** We've joined forces with Antony Melville of RainForest Saver, and originator of the change.org anti-expressway petition, to deliver both ours and his petitions to Downing Street on 26th February. We will walk from Old Palace Yard, opposite the Houses of Parliament, to Downing Street. If you've not already done so, please add your name to our petition at <u>noexpressway.org/petition-signup</u>.

*Next stop Westminster!* On 26 February NEG will also hold a drop-in event for MPs and Peers to come and find out more about the destruction that the Oxford to Cambridge Expressway and target of one million houses would cause to our environment, wildlife, health and communities. This event is co-sponsored by Layla Moran (Lib Dem, Oxford West & Abingdon), Greg Smith (Conservative, Buckingham) and Daniel Zeichner (Labour, Cambridge). *We are delighted to have cross-party and cross-Arc support.* 

**Status of the Ox-Cam Expressway.** During the pre-election purdah period, Grant Shapps, Transport Secretary, announced a 'priority review' of the Ox-Cam expressway. There has been no news about any review of the Expressway. Responding to parliamentary questions, George Freeman, (now) ex-Transport Minister said *"We will provide an update on whether the project should continue in due course."* Iain Stewart MP (MK South) unofficially announced the Expressway is cancelled at a small meeting in Woburn Sands on 7th February, but at PMQs on 12th February the PM refused confirm this, responding to Daniel Zeichner MP as follows "I must ask the Honourable Gentleman to wait to contain his impatience until the Budget and he will learn more about the National Infrastructure Plan." At time of writing, the budge content and date are not confirmed. Our campaign must keep up the pressure. *Nothing is cancelled yet!* 

**One million houses.** During the election campaign Grant Shapps stated that the Local Authorities across the Arc had told him that 'they can still build those (one million) houses and that they don't need a road blasting through the countryside to do that'. NEG submitted Freedom of Information requests on this subject to 28 Local Authorities and the Department for Transport (DfT). The DfT and 21 of the 28 Local Authorities

have responded to this request indicating that they have no record of any discussion or consultation having taken place regarding the housing target. NEG is disappointed that a Government Minister is quite so 'economical with the truth'. Does this mean housing targets will be driven by Central Government regardless of any consultation with Local Authorities or local communities?

**NEG** activities. We continue to raise awareness with events in Bedfordshire and Buckinghamshire and more roadside signs put up in February. See all the information and our news feed noexpressway.org.

Many of you will be aware that asbestos was found in the box containing the blower which is responsible for generating the air that passes into the organ pipework. We are not allowed to use the organ at present and the cost of removing the asbestos and cleaning all the pipes will be in the order of £20,000. The PCC is currently considering how best to move this forward. We will keep you informed of those decisions. The asbestos and the blower are being removed week beginning 24<sup>th</sup> February and will entail a decontamination unit placed on the road outside the gate. Unfortunately, the unit is too tall to enter the Churchyard.

The recent storms have led to some trees being blown over in the village. As a reminder here is a useful list of the numbers that you can report weather related issues on-

- 999 -To report fallen trees/other debris which pose a risk to your safety or the safety of others.
- 101 -To report a fallen tree/debris which doesn't pose a high risk but needs to be dealt with.
- 105 If you lose power or can see that a power line has come down.
- 999 If you have a flooding emergency which is a threat to someone's life, contact Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service.
- 0345 310 1111 To report flooding relating to a highway such as blocked ditches, blocked drains or flooding on a road call Oxfordshire County Council Floodline.

There has been a spate of thefts in the Village. Please ensure doors, windows, any outbuilding and oil tanks are locked. Also ensure that you report any criminal activity to the Police either 999 (if an emergency), or 111.

It has been suggested that the Village could start up a neighbourhood watch scheme. If anyone is interested in this, please contact the Parish Council. This ensures that the Police are aware of rural crime.

Thames Valley Police has been performing speed checks and the Parish Council continues to work with them on this issue
