
#### Church Flectoral Roll

#### The Otmoor Flyer

The Otmoor Flyer is the name of a sixteen-seater bus which serves four of the Otmoor villages. This initiative came about after standard bus services were discontinued due to the austerity cuts in funding.




The Otmoor Flyer serves Horton-cum-Studley and Beckley on Tuesdays and Fridays, and Forest Hill and Stanton St John on Mondays and Thursdays. It is thanks to the hard work of a group of Parish Council representatives from each of the villages that this very valuable bus service has been procured. Although it is a fairly limited service, leaving at 10.30am and returning from Oxford (in Broad Street) at 1.15pm, it is invaluable for members of these rural communities who, for one reason or another, don't drive a car. At £3 for a return ticket, it is also a lot cheaper than taking a taxi in and out of Oxford.

A Bus Token Card with 5 return journeys costs £15, 10 return journeys - £30 and 20 return journeys - £60. Cards can be purchased at Stanton St John Village Shop (01865 351532), from Jill Meyjes, 12 Forge Close, Horton cum Studley (01865 351496), Dee Hazell, The Old Chapel, High Street, Beckley (01865 358809) and Malcolm Leeding, 86 Mickle Way, Forest Hill.

I would strongly urge as many parishioners as possible to purchase a Bus Token Card, whether you use the bus regularly or not, as the service needs to be heavily subsidised for it to survive. All four Parish Councils have given financial support to enable the Otmoor Flyer to run as it does. Those who use the bus benefit not only from the freedom it provides them to go into Headington or Oxford City Centre, but also to socialise with friends and acquaintances on a regular basis. For example, the Flyer is available to take villagers from Horton-cum-Studley to the regular coffee morning at the community pub in Beckley on Fridays.

I commend the following people for their hard work on this project: Jill Meyjes, John Battye, Malcolm Leeding, David Polgreen, Barbara Jewell, Ann Purse and Dee Hazell. It's a real pleasure to take over from Dee as the treasurer for the Otmoor Flyer Organising Group. We've all agreed that, until a regular bus service is restored, the Otmoor Flyer is fulfilling a vital need, especially for people who would otherwise be stuck at home.

#### Proposed Oxford to Cambridge Expressway

The Department for Transport has pledged to create an 'Expressway', i.e. a dual carriageway from Oxford to Cambridge. The Expressway is designed to support a proposed 'Growth Corridor' stretching from Oxford via Milton Keynes to Cambridge, which is to deliver 1 million new houses in the area by 2050. Work on the Expressway is due to start by 2025.

Route S2 of the proposed Expressway would severely affect the parishes of Forest Hill, Stanton St John, Beckley, Horton-cum-Studley, Murcot and Fencott. Although the exact route has not been published it would spur off the A34 between Abingdon and Oxford, go past Garsington, across Shotover, between Sandhills and Forest Hill and through Stanton St John. It would certainly destroy parts of Rectory Farm, possibly Woodperry House and then cross the Horton Road east of Beckley near Beckley Park. It would then cross parts of Otmoor between Murcot and Fencott, and meet the M40 to the south of Bicester. This route is remarkably similar to one of the proposed routes for the M40, which was rejected.

The Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) Oxfordshire is campaiging for a public inquiry into the Oxford-Cambridge 'Growth Corridor' and 'Expressway', so that decisions are open and transparent. The Oxfordshire Expressway Action Group [EAG] has been formed to oppose all the southerly routes (CPRE have produced a useful map, reproduced on the opposite page, showing these on their web site - <a href="http://www.cpreoxon.org.uk/campaigns">http://www.cpreoxon.org.uk/campaigns</a>) and we have submitted evidence through them.

Locally, I want to encourage our parishes to work together specifically to oppose route S2. The decision will be made on which 'corridor' this summer. I will discuss this with each Parish Council and then hold a meeting so we can work together to oppose route S2.

#### Lincoln College Choir, St. Nicolas Church, Sun 4 Mar, 3pm



The choir of Lincoln College makes a welcome return to St Nicolas, Forest Hill, for a recital of choral and organ music featuring repertoire from the their forthcoming tour to Malta.

The choir holds a reputation as one of the finest mixed-voice chapel

choirs at the University of Oxford and we are delighted that they have agreed to take precious time out during term to come and sing for us.

#### Pergolesi 'Stabat Mater', St Nicolas Church, Sun 11 Mar, 3pm

Julia Stutfield (soprano) and organist Claire Woodham, are performing Pergolesi's moving 'Stabat Mater' again this year, together with Pippa Thynne (alto). This lyrical setting of the traditional Latin text addressed to Mary at the foot of the cross was composed by Italian composer Giovanni Battista Pergolesi not long before his death in 1736 and has been popular ever since.

As with all Sunday afternoon concerts at St Nicolas, the programme will last about 45 minutes, after which tea and cake will be served.

#### Oxford Welsh Male Voice Choir, Beckley Church, Sat 17 Mar, 7pm

Concert by the Oxford Welsh Male Voice Choir and friends with accompanying items, and refreshments in the interval. Tickets, £10, available from the Abingdon Arms, or on the door. Profits in aid of Médecins sans Frontières.



The concert was suggested by the choir themselves, in memory of Lyn Davies, who lived in Beckley for many years and was a keen member of the choir.

#### Gesualdo 'Tenebrae', St. Nicolas Church, Sun 18 Mar, 3pm

Carlo Gesualdo was an Italian prince, born in the south of Italy around 1561, who is best known for having murdered his wife and her lover. He composed a number of unaccompanied vocal pieces, in which he experimented with word painting through extremes of harmony. The St Nicolas Consort, under the direction of Marie Power, will perform some of the 'Tenebrae Responsories' for Holy Saturday which contain many vivid examples of his unique and extraordinary musical style.

#### Buxtehude Cantata, St Barnabas Church, Wed 28 Mar, 6.30pm

'Membra Jesu nostri' (The Limbs of our Jesus) is a cantata by Dietrich Buxtehude composed in 1680. It is divided into 7 parts each addressing a different part of Christ's crucified body: feet, hands, sides, breast, heart and face. The mediaeval Latin text is full of sorrow and love and the music is poignant and beautiful.

The cantata will be performed by a group of 10 solo singers brought together by Julia Stutfield and Marie Power for this occasion.


# Forest Hill with Shotover Parish Council Village Clean Up – 3 March

#### **Tearfund Service & Lunch**

Please join us at the **Tearfund Lunch on Sat 18 March** at 12.15pm in the Millennium Hall and help provide funds to support Ethiopian Christians. The offering from the morning service at 11.00am will also be given to help fund the project.

#### Tearfund Project Report, February 2018

Our contributions are enabling Ethiopian Christians to organise people from poor families into self-help groups. They work mainly with women from the poorest families in urban areas who require support on a number of fronts including literacy and education & training on HIV & AIDS, health, hygiene and sanitation.

3723 people have been trained this last year in health and hygiene! Here's how: 7 workshops were held and 9 consulting support workshops, which were delivered for 3 self-help groups working on means to prevent disease. In total, 72 people were trained, among them 13 women. All trained facilitators then delivered their own training to other groups on a weekly basis to achieve the remarkable total of 3273.

The self-help group members are also starting to put into action the things they have learnt: building toilets, water taps, digging pits for rubbish, and using boiling water. This is so encouraging to see!

She always enjoyed a few simple stems from friend's own gardens. Donations to Helen House Children's Hospice, in memory of her only grandchild, Beatrice Carr. A portion of these will be gifted to R.O.S.Y. (Respite Nursing for Oxfordshire's Sick Youngsters).


