#### Expressway Group

The Horton-cum-Studley Expressway Team, with members from Beckley too, have continued to be very active in their campaign to raise awareness of the potential Oxford-Cambridge Expressway and encourage people to sign the SaveOtmoor petition and stay in touch with the group and its activities.

The group's Walk the Moor event was a great success with around 100 people enjoying the walk and the views, as well as the music of the Riot of Gollins at the lunch stop. The group has also run SaveOtmoor stands at Boarstall and Arncott fetes, Beckley Open Day, Forest Hill Feast and at Rectory Farm. There has been a lot of interest and concern expressed at all events.



The group have been reported in the local media following a meeting with Keith Taylor our Green MEP as well as the Walk the Moor event.

The HcS Expressway Team are now planning to **re-enact the Otmoor Riots at the St Giles Fair on 3 September**, permissions and Shire Horse permitting, and are arranging a **Peggy Seger concert to be held in Beckley Church on 13 October at 7.30pm**! More information on both to follow.

The decision on the Expressway corridor is now expected late summer. It has also been leaked that the new Housing Minister, Kit Malthouse, has asked all Councils and Local Enterprise Partnerships (LEP's) along the proposed corridor as well as the Universities to submit **ideas by 14 Sep** of where the additional 1 million new homes should be built (300,000 + in Oxfordshire). So the campaign to object to the Expressway and any associated development, particularly on Green Belt is all the more important. If you live in Horton-cum-Studley, please can you write to object to this timescale and undemocratic approach by writing to David Hughes, Barry Wood, Dan Sames, Ian Hudspeth, and Martin Tipple.

#### St. John the Baptist Church Chancel Ceiling

In October last year, while planned repair work was underway in the church, a sudden fall of plaster occurred in the Chancel. The lime plaster forming the ceiling had cracked and broken away from the wooden laths which possibly date from the Victorian rebuilding of the east wall.

The PCC decided to postpone the planned second phase of interior work to address this dangerous development. Specialist contract works are planned and they are due to be tendered imminently. The PCC's budget for the work is £60,000 and it is hoped that the works will complete early in 2019.

The need to sustain this important focal building in the village requires our involvement as a community so all help is welcome, particularly in raising funds. At this stage we need **volunteers to help apply for grants** by filling out and tracking all the applications. The initial work is done, and sources for grants are identified. #### A Tale of Tithes and Takeovers: The Story Behind Beckley's Medieval Stained Glass

In the last issue of the 'Four Parishes News Magazine' a riddle was posed about why Horton was part of Beckley parish until 1880. But actually it wasn't Horton that was the 'poor relation': it was Beckley, which was subjected to a medieval version of a hostile takeover by Studley Priory in 1352. Then as now, it was all about money: a tale of tithes and takeovers.

Edmond de Lodelaw, the priest at Beckley from 1318, launched a lawsuit against the vicar of Oakley, claiming the right to tithes from Bernwood forest. What happened next is a wonderfully modern and intriguing story, which I will tell in an illustrated talk on **Sunday 7 October at 4pm in Beckley church** to raise funds for the wall paintings restoration. The cost will be £8 per person and refreshments will be offered.

#### **Beckley Village Hall**

The use of the new Hall is continuing to develop and, with professional management of the bookings system, we have improved and regular feedback, as well as key financial data. In the ten months since the appointment of our new Booking Secretary we have hired the Hall over three hundred times and for a total of around 1200 hours. The Trustees have been able to offer discounted rates for activities benefitting the community, which are subsidised by a limited number of purely commercial hires. The Hiring Policy can be seen on the village hall web site: www.beckleyvillagehall.org/Documents.php.

We have also given the Booking Secretary the discretionary right to refuse bookings that present a risk of disturbance to the near neighbours of the Hall and this discretion has already been used. We are due to have our first AGM this autumn which will provide the Trustees with the opportunity to brief the Village on the operation of the Hall since its opening. As always we welcome expressions of interest from potential new Trustees. Please contact Geoff Mills or any other current Trustee if you would like to discuss this. #### POSTSCRIPT: Curiouser and Curiouser!

#### Do you know?

Forest Hill seems to have a thing about poets. Did you know there is a connection between the village and the Scottish ballade 'There's nae luck aboot the Hoose' ? [1] It is the poet William Julius Mickle [1735 - 1788] [2].

William lodged at the Manor House from 1771 until 1775, tenant of Robert Tomkins. He was working at the Clarendon Press in Oxford at the time, as a corrector. While there he accomplished his greatest success, the translation of the Portuguese epic, Camoen's 'Lusiad'.

You will recall that the manor had another literary association, John Milton, who married the daughter of the house. By strange co-



incidence, so did William. In 1781 he married Robert Tomkin's daughter Mary and they settled in Wheatley. He died in 1788 while on a visit to Forest Hill



and was buried there. Mary was buried there too in 1811.

Their tomb stone is to be found in the north aisle of St Nicholas Church, leaning against the wall, where it was deposited when the new vestry was constructed.




